



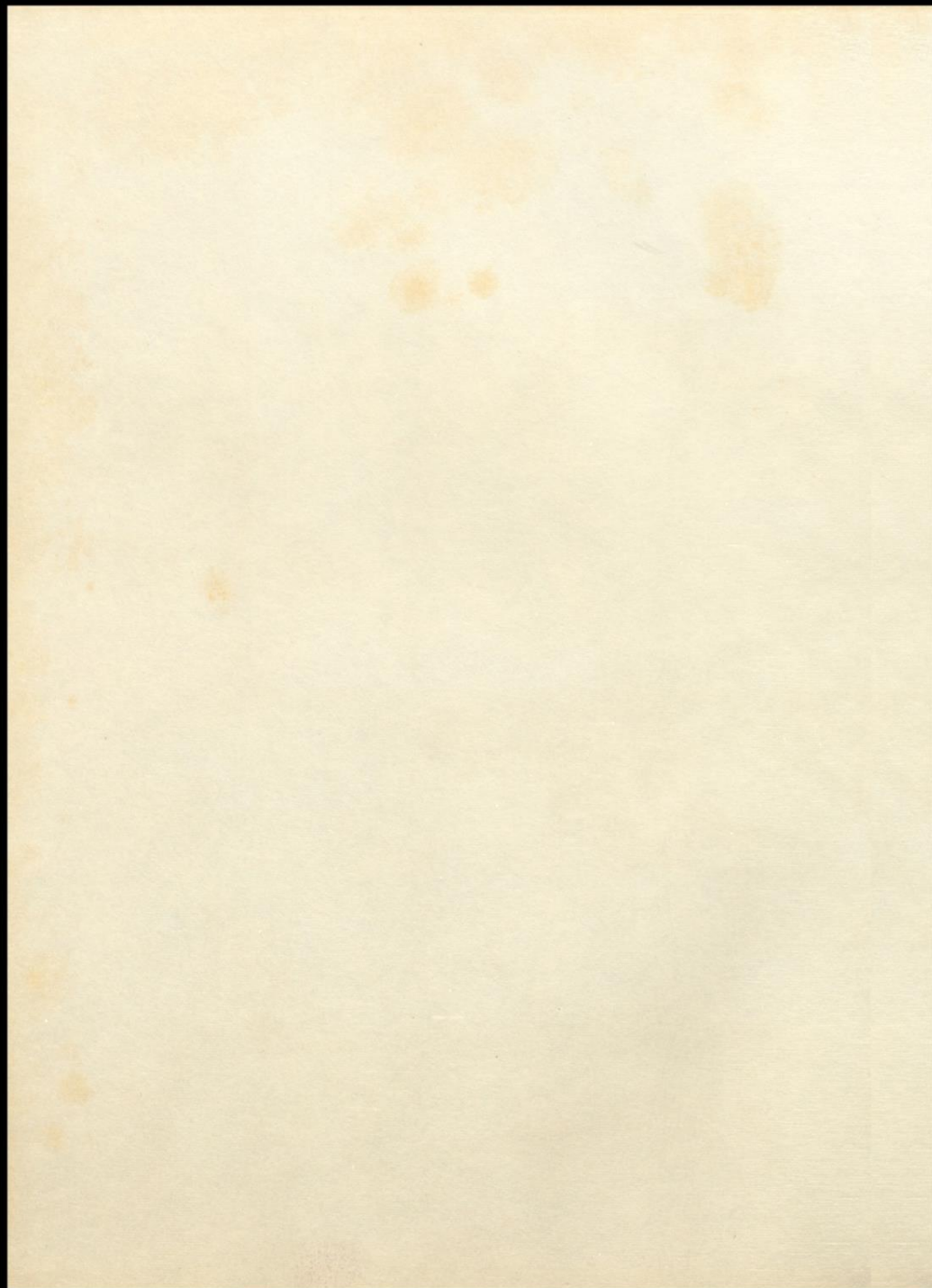

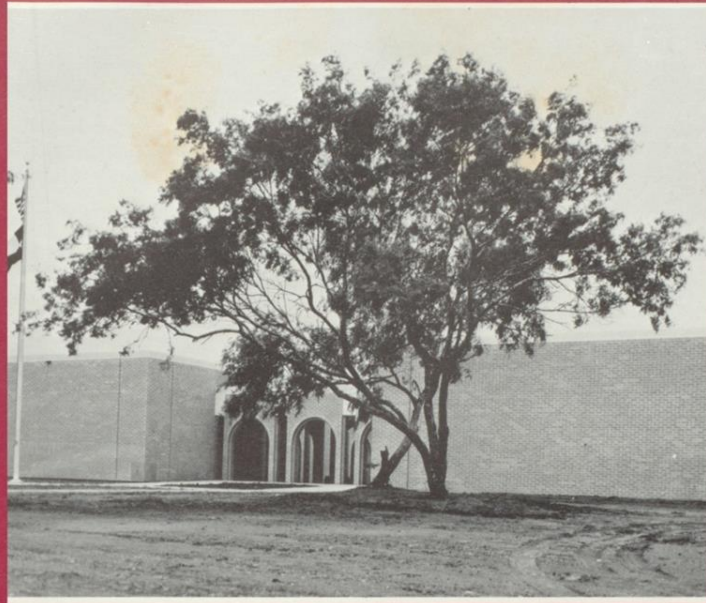








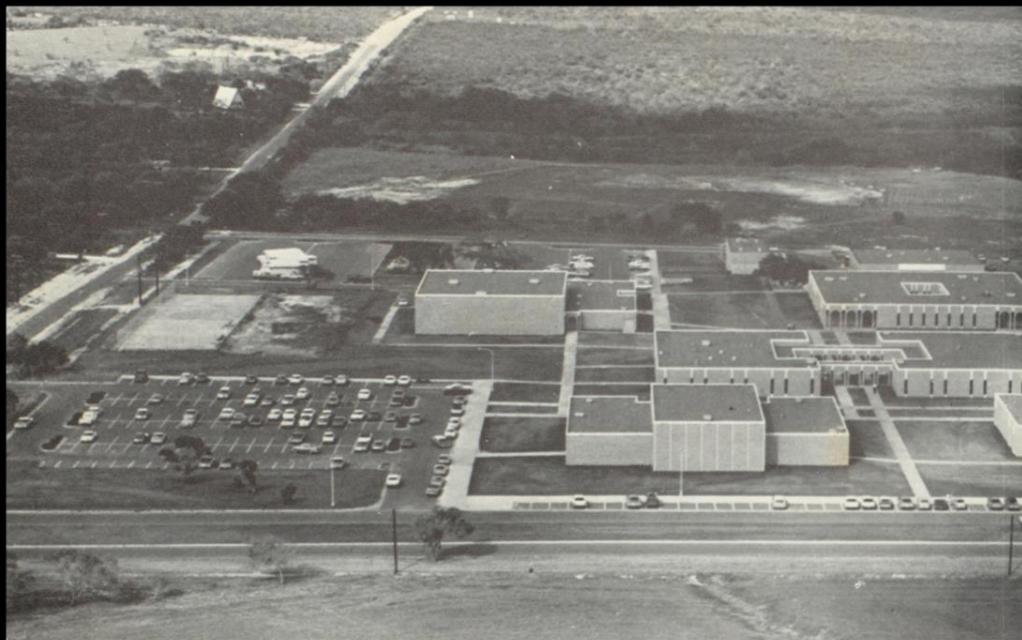

### I AWAIT

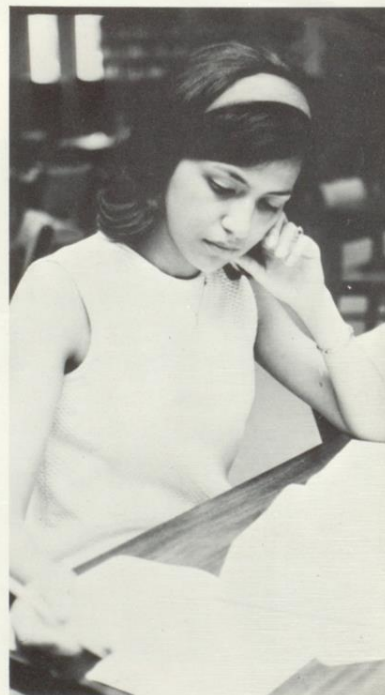
I stand before you

     "You have shown me life." . . .





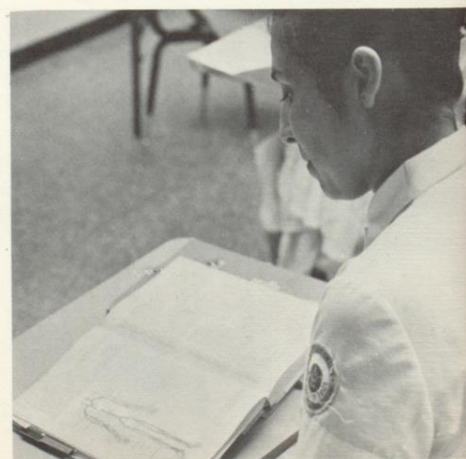


Some of you will shun me

"You have shown me death." . . .

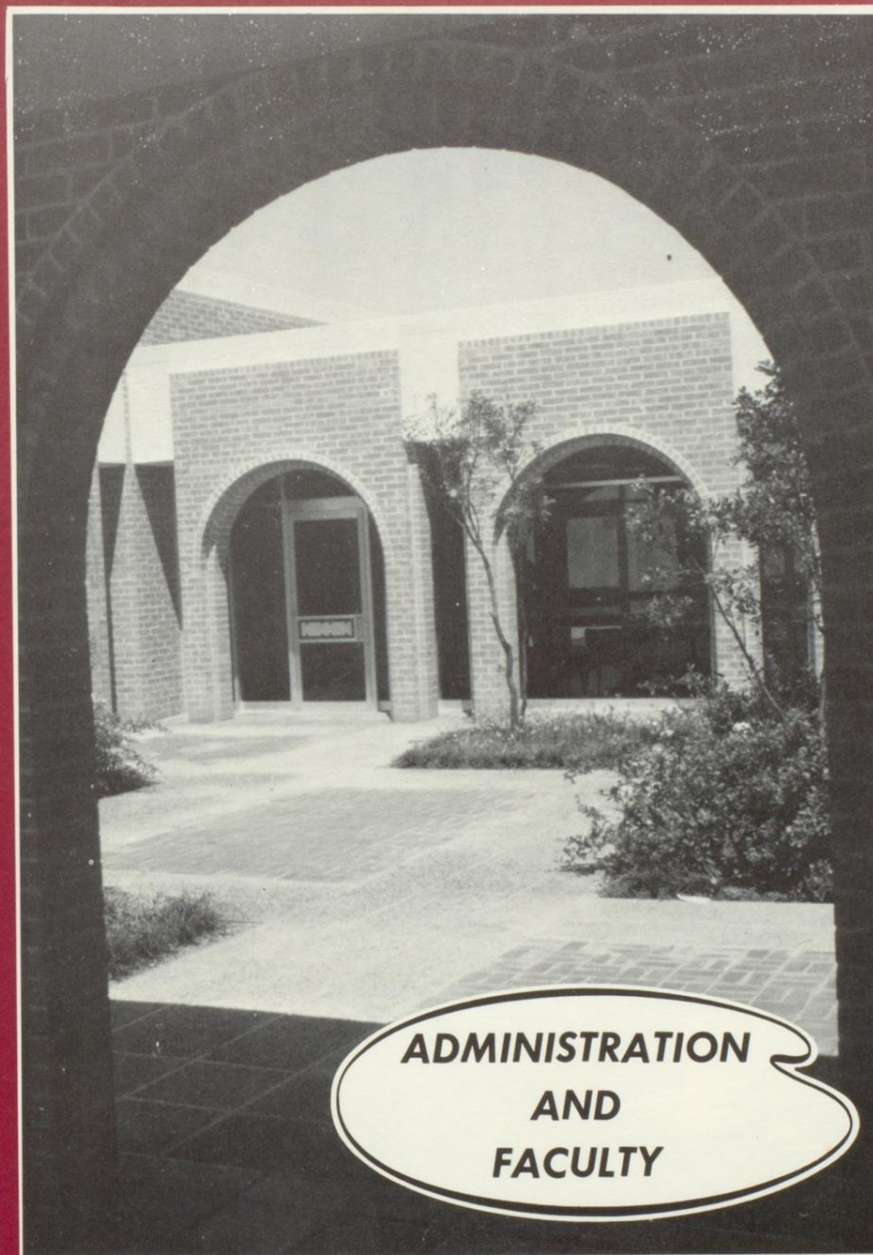

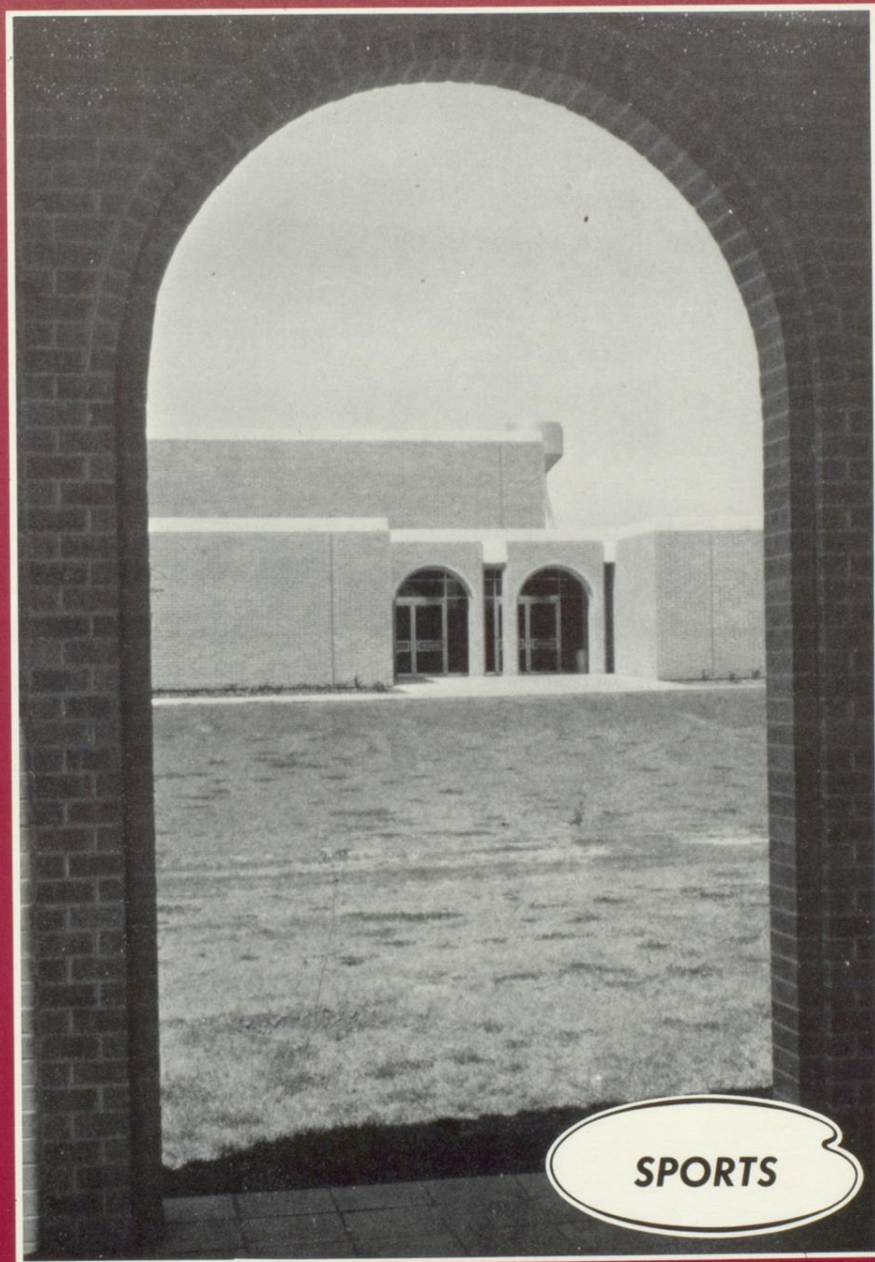

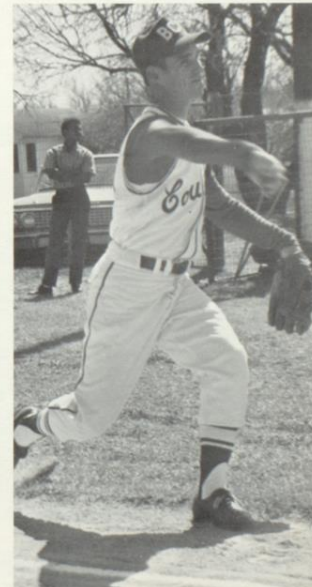

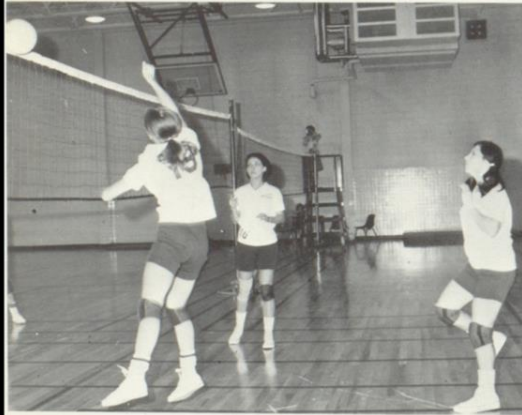

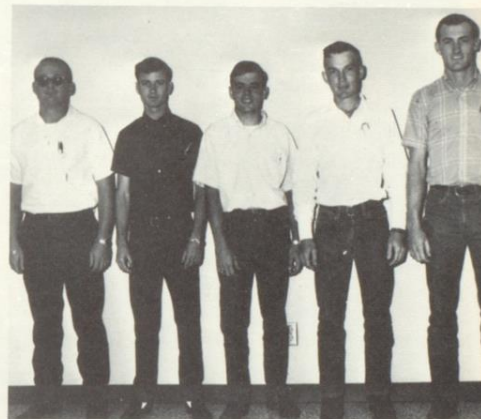

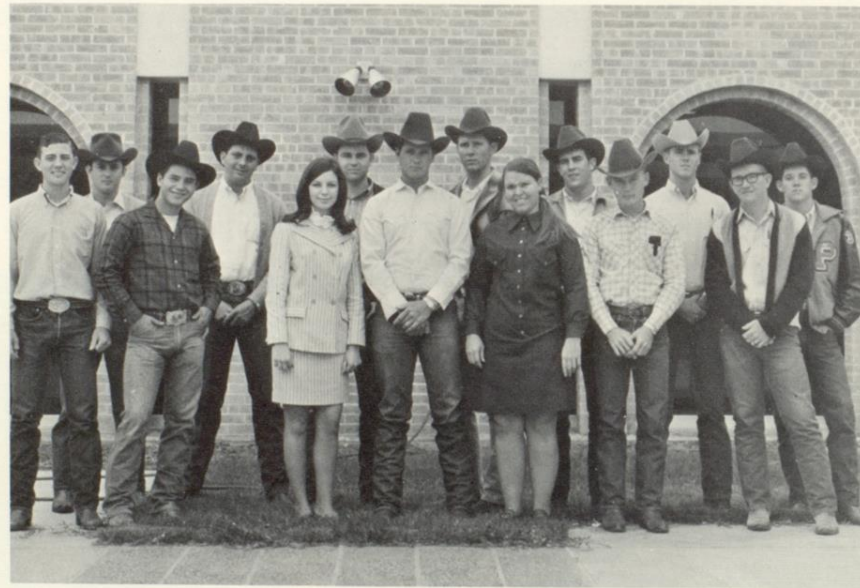

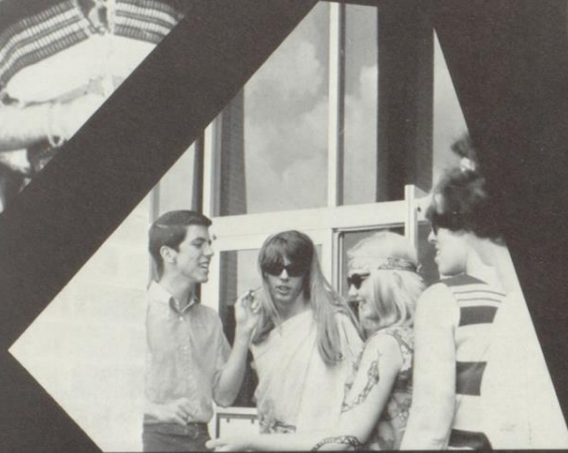

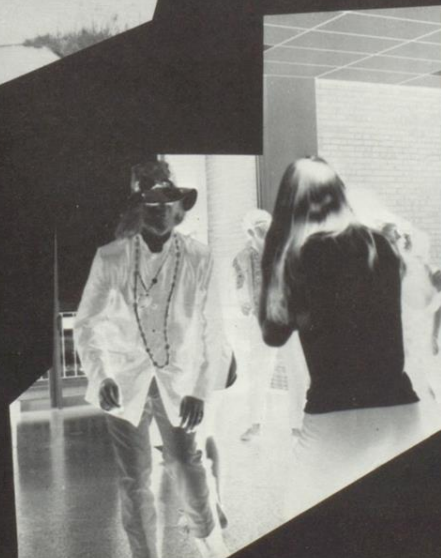
Aziz Shihab, copy editor of the *San Antonio Evening News and Express* discusses the Middle East crisis.

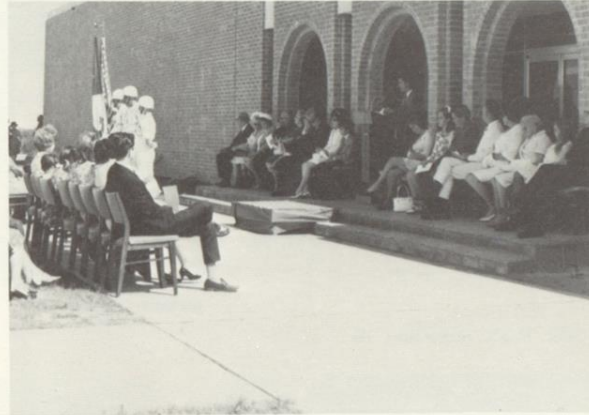
