# College Memories

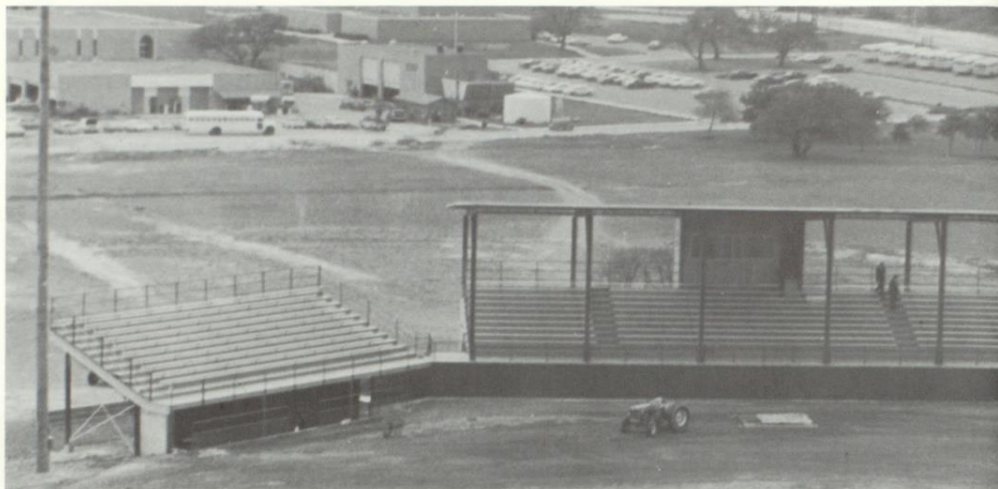
From the appearance of the cold brick walls

It's amazing what you can do.

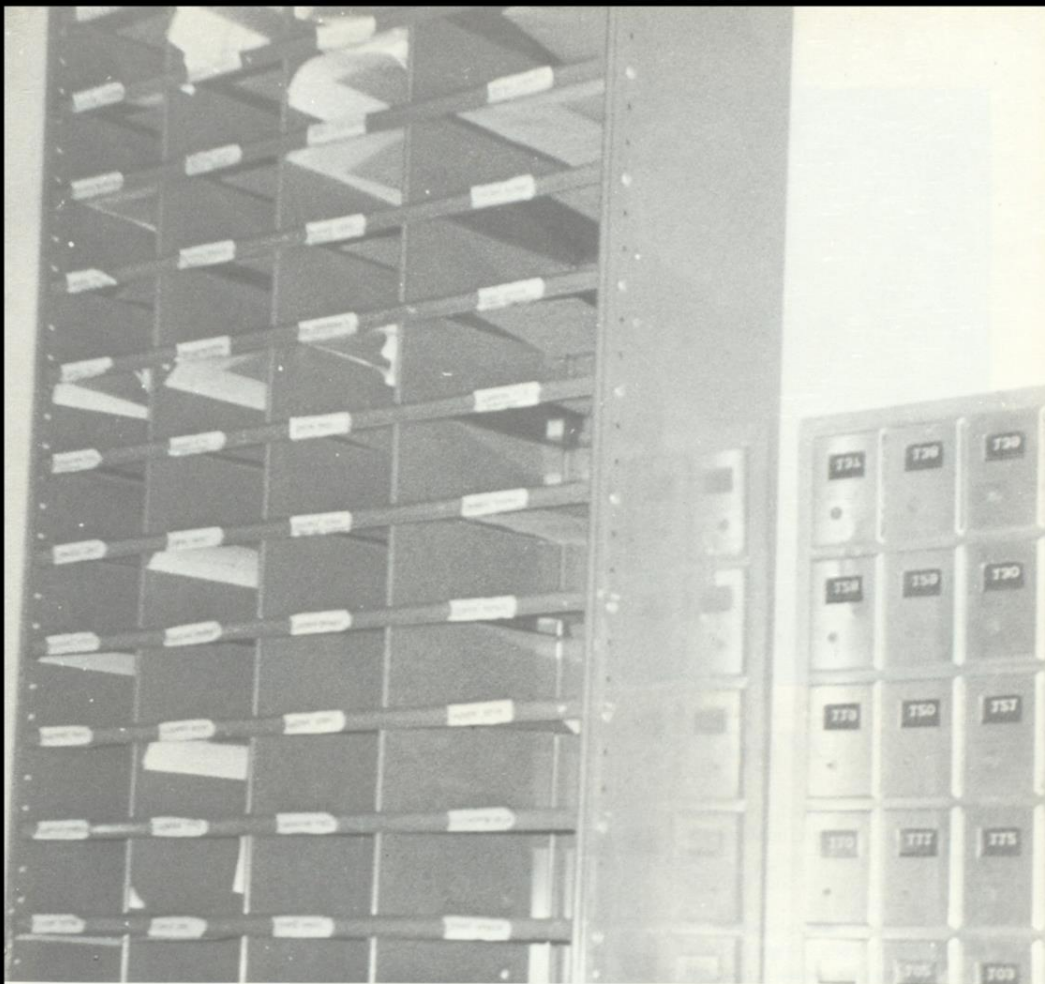
Though these things fall back in our memories

This year marked many firsts for Bee County College. Under the direction of the Board of Trustees, BCC has shown amazing progress. New vocational-technical programs that were initiated or approved are: Career Pilot, Teacher Aides, Nurse Aide, and Auto Body Repair. Additions to the physical plant include the completion of Joe Hunter Memorial Field, approval of plans for constructing a 150 unit dormitory complex, and planning of an Auto Body Repair Shop Building. In academic areas, provisions have been made for students to enroll for credit while still attending high school. Improvements have been made in the math, science, and engineering transfer programs and a physics for liberal arts students has been added. Course offerings in art and social sciences have been expanded, and the Department of Cosmetology was opened. The Channel 2 television station went on the air. Through their efforts many community service programs were

held at BCC.

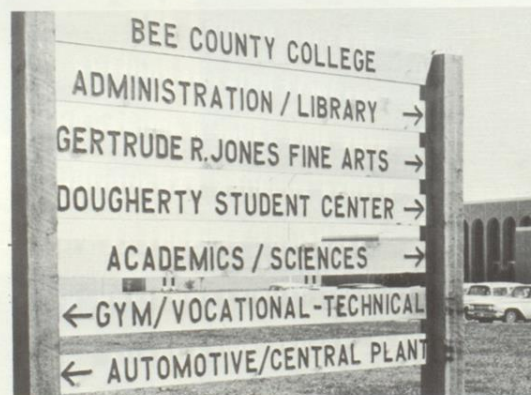
## *The Growth and Development of Bee County College*

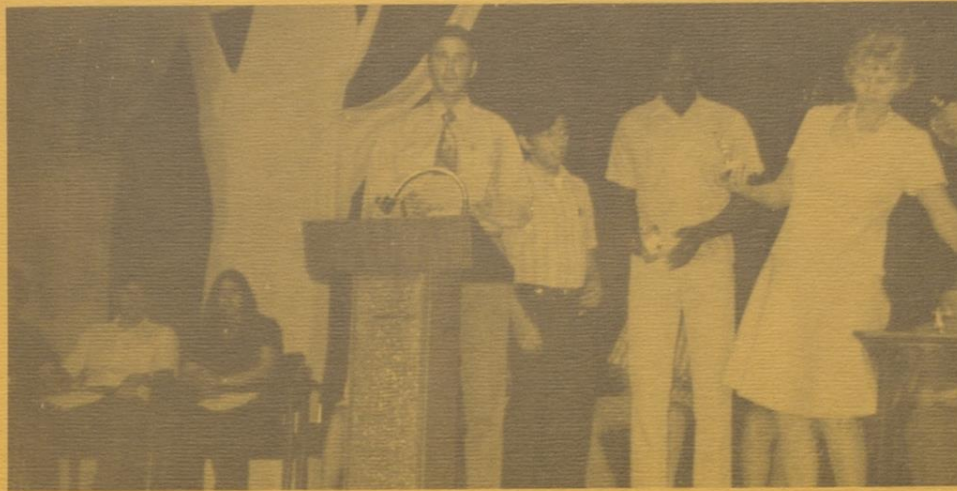

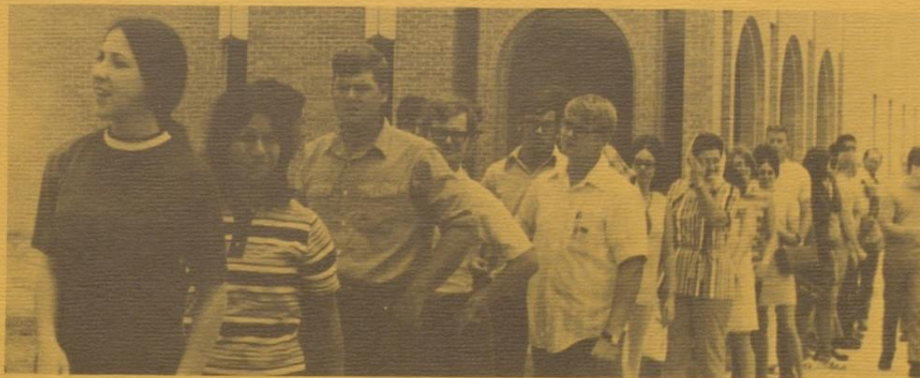
## Graduation 1971

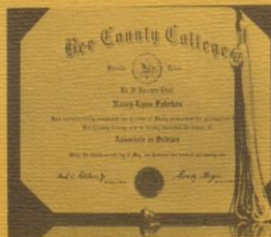

Senator Wayne Connally addressed the graduating class. He challenged them to accomplish much in life saying:

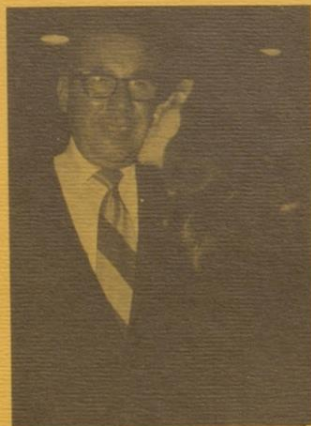

## *In Dedication*

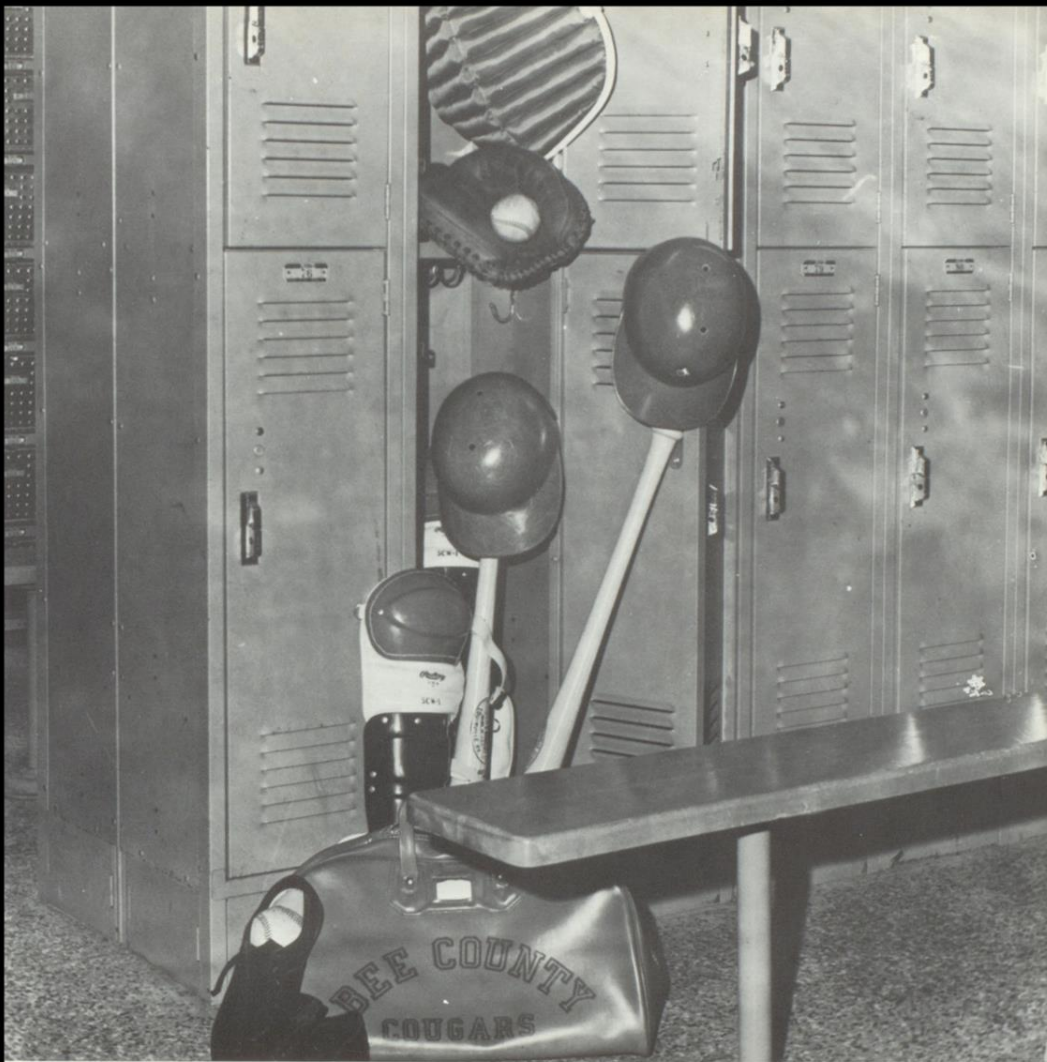

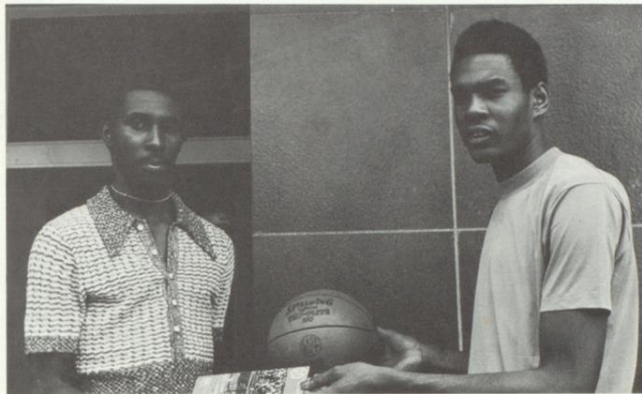

# Baptist Student Union



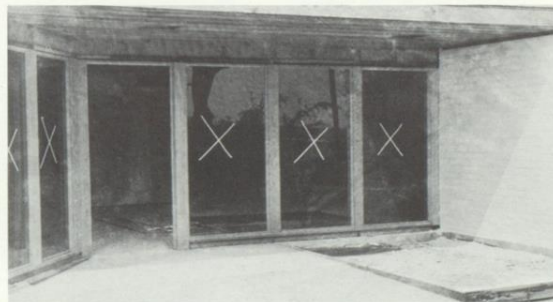

Members also attended several religious films. The BSU also started a publication on campus, ONE WAY, Published bimonthly.

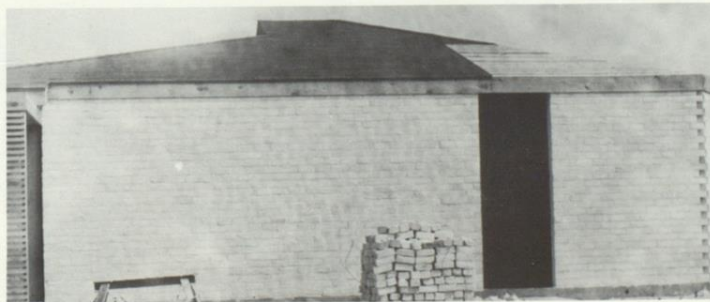

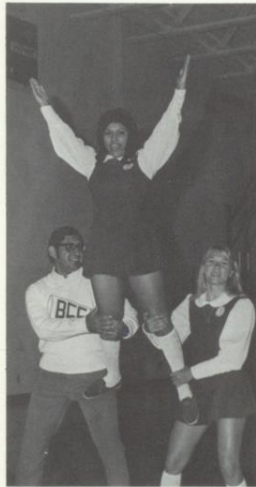

## Student Senate

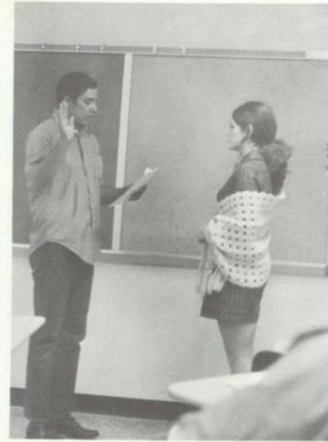
The Student Government Association, commonly referred to as the Senate, is composed of freshman and sophomore students elected by the student body in the fall. These students work to make BCC a better college.
