
Best Over-All Door

The following Friday, September 17, the mighty Trojans faced the Victoria Stroman Raiders in a game marked by bad luck. Spectators, as well as players battled the mud and the mosquitos. The absence of the Pep Squad and the Band, delayed by a flat tire, marred the first quarter of play. The Raiders took the lead early, and when the first half of play was over, Stroman led 13-0.

The second half was no better for the Trojan offense, but the defense held the Raiders on several strategic plays.

Despite the determination of the Trojans, the final score was a heartbreaking 33-0 in favor of the Raiders.



Knights and Texans Triumph






On September 24, the public turned out to witness the Trojan's second game against the Austin McCallum Knights. Despite the watery deluge, which soaked players and fans alike, the Trojans fought with courage and resolution to end the game on the short side of 28 to 7.

The following week Beeville traveled to Corpus Christi's Cabaniss Field to confront the Ray Texans. Each team allowed the other only one touchdown during the first half, which ended with the score 7-6 in favor of Ray.

The Texans came back to score three touchdowns in the last half to win the game 20-6.



Trojans Proclaimed "Team of the Week"


October 4 was the date of the Beeville Trojans' greatest defeat and victory--defeat on the scoreboard, but victory in the minds of players, coaches, fans, and the Corpus Christi Caller.

The game commenced with Beasley Field overflowing with a Parents' Night crowd. The Buccaneers made a quick seven points early in the game, but the Trojans did not allow the expected rerun of previous games to continue. Dropping the passing strategy used in previous games, the Trojans utilized a running attack led by Carl Hinderman and Robert Hudman. The adopted strategy worked to the Trojans' advantage and produced a touchdown in the second quarter. The Trojans alternately

rushed and passed to finish the first half with a 13-7 lead.

The third period was quiet; the fourth, riotous. Early in the fourth the Trojans again scored another six points. But the Buccaneers recovered long enough to score a touchdown, now behind 20-14. The Bucs again scored in the last seven seconds in what has come to be known as the "play of the disputed handoff." The kick after left the score an unbelievable 21-20 in favor of Miller.

For the Trojans, the defeat ended on the field; the victory came Monday morning. The Corpus Christi Caller proclaimed the Beeville Trojans as the Team of the Week, "the perennial, but courageous loser," who won the pride and respect of all.

Hoping again to utilize the running attack adopted in the Miller game, the Beeville Trojans prepared for the battle of the Trojans. The stands were packed with alumni and students who had shown unprecedented spirit during the week following the Miller game.

However, the Moody Trojans had the advantage; they were geared for the running attack which had surprised Miller in the previous game. Unable to move on the ground, Beeville had to switch to an air attack, but not before Moody took the halftime lead of 16-0, the culmination of two touchdowns and a safety.

Both teams scored two touchdowns each in the last half of play, with the final score being 29-12.

The following week the Trojans journeyed to Alice to meet the future District 27-4A champions. Unable to stop the Coyotes or to score against the powerful team, the Trojans left the southwest town on the underside of the score. 41-7.

Bulls and Horses Trample Trojans

On October 29, the Beeville Tro jans faced the Corpus Christi King Mustangs in a contest which ended in a 41-6 loss for the Trojans. The Mustangs built a 20-0 lead in the first quarter. By halftime, the Mustangs had gained another seven points. No one scored in the third quarter. The Trojans put six points on the scoreboard in the fourth quarter, but was unable to stop the rushing and passing game of King. Joe Hoffman recovered two of six King fumbles. Johnny Leal punted a 68 yarder, the longest one he kicked all season.

The following week, the Beeville Trojans confronted the visiting Kingsville Brahmas at Beasley Stadium. In the first quarter, both teams remained scoreless. By the end of the second quarter, Kingsville led 12-0.

After the half, the Brahmas advanced to bring the score to 20-0. The Trojans took possession of the ball at the first of the fourth quarter. Under the direction of QB Randy Fowler, Beeville scored on an

aerial pass to Narciso Trevino, with Fowler kicking the point after. The

Brahmas scored twice before the game ended with the score 33-7.

The Trojans played their last game of the season at Beasley Stadium on November 12. The Corpus Christi Carroll Tigers won with the final score of 49-0. The Trojans managed to get the ball twice in the first quarter, but each time they had to give it up. Carroll took a 14-0 lead at the end of the first quarter and a 21-0 lead by halftime. Because the Trojans were unable to complete only four passes in the game, their scoring ability was greatly diminished.

This was the last game for seniors Joe Esquivel; Joe Hoffman; Robert Hudman; Johnny Leal, tri-captain; Joe Pittman; Bob Richey, tri-captain; Elvie Tippens, tri-captain; Jerry Trevino; and Robert Harry Trevino. Carl Hinderman and Robbie Trevino also played their last game due to the eligibility rules.

The entire Beeville Trojan team displayed determination, ability, and stamina throughout the 1971 season. Head coach Sandy Sands expressed his feeling about the team when he commented after the Miller game, "It's hard to keep going when you're losing, but our players still came up with a heck of an effort."



The duties of the Board of Education are: (a) to provide for a school and to establish general policies in keeping with the needs of the community and requirements of the law; (b) to select the Superintendent and to support him in the discharge of his duties; (c) to elect school personnel upon nomination and recommendation of the Superintendent; (d) to set salary schedules; (e) to consider and act upon policies for the school program; (f) to require and evaluate the reports of the Superintendent concerning the progress and financial status of the schools; (g) to consider and adopt an annual budget; (h) to consult with the Superintendent on his recommendations for school; (i) to assist in presenting to the public the needs and progress of the educational system; (j) to provide by the exercise of its legal powers the funds necessary to finance the operation of the school; (k) to perform the specific duties imposed upon the Board by law.

Last year our school district was visited by representatives of the U.S. Department of Health, Education, and Welfare. After looking at our school system, the representatives felt that we needed to work out a plan that would increase understanding and cooperation among the different ethnic groups in our schools. The plan finally decided upon was a human relations study among students in grades 7 through 12. The idea was for us to try to understand some of our problems and to look for ways of solving them.

The plan was started in October when the Student Councils of the Thomas Jefferson Junior High School and the A. C. Jones High School nominated three Mexican Americans, three Anglos, and three Blacks to serve as members of the Student Advisory Committee. Three of the students were from the Thomas Jefferson Junior High School and six were from the A. C. Jones High School.








