




### B.I.S.D. School Board



### Superintendent



Mr. Roberts came to Beeville in July of 1956 to serve as the Superintendent of Schools. His background included classroom teaching, coaching, and administration as assistant principal, principal and superintendent. He received his bachelor of science degree and master's degree in education and government from West Texas State University in Canyon. In order to stay current in the changing scene of school administration Mr. Roberts attended many conferences arranged especially for school administrators by the University of Texas at Austin and by Texas A& M University. He is a life member of Texas State Teachers Association and a member of the American Association of School Administrators, National Education Association and Texas Association of School Administrators. On February 1, 1973, he accepted the challenge of working with the Texas State Teachers Association as Assistant Executive Secretary. The effects of his efforts in education can be seen in an improved educational program in the local schools and his interests in professional organizations have been beneficial to the educational program across the state.









Debbie Guerra




