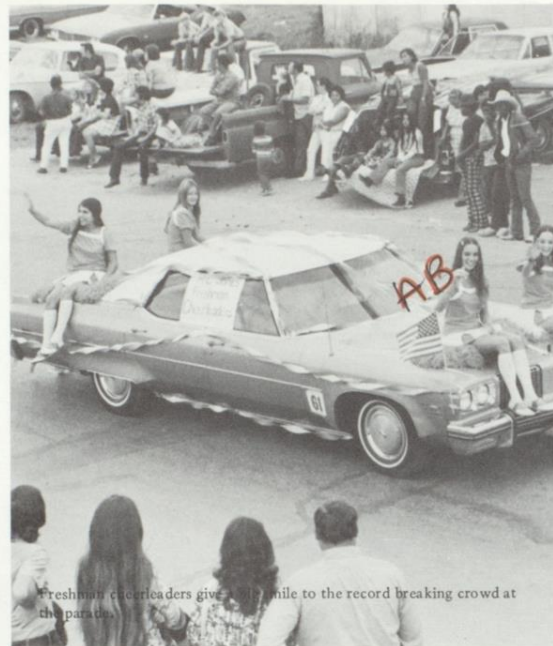
Jones Students Participate In Western Week Activities.

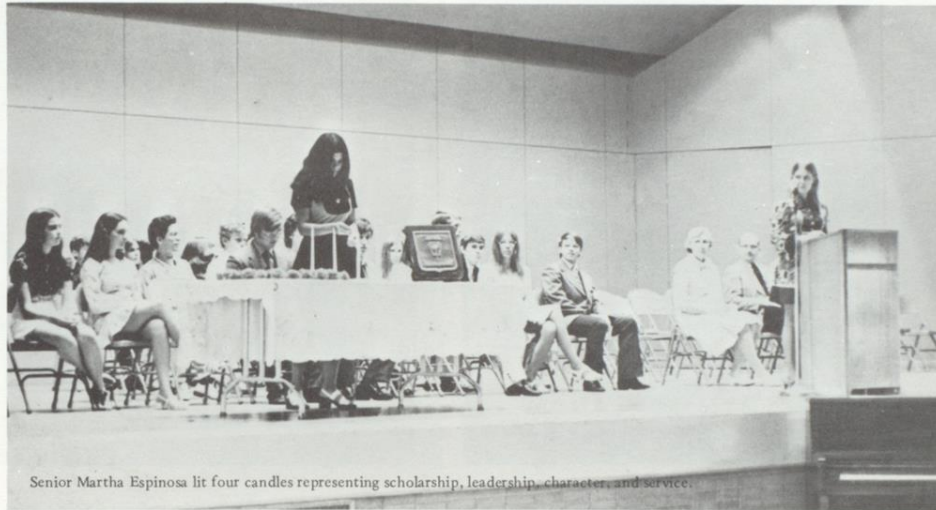

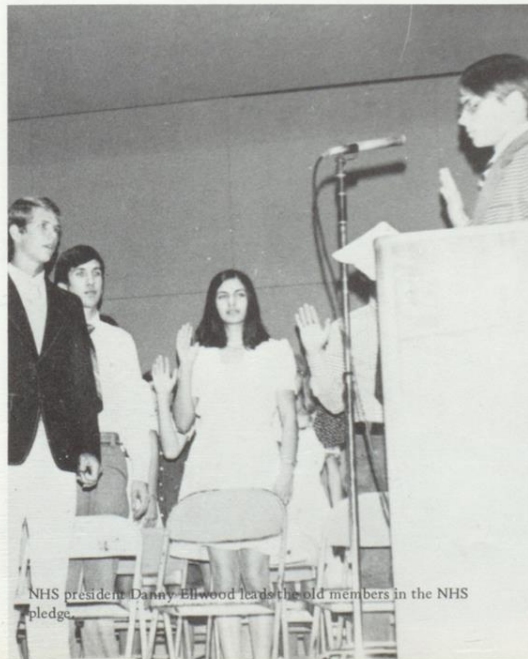

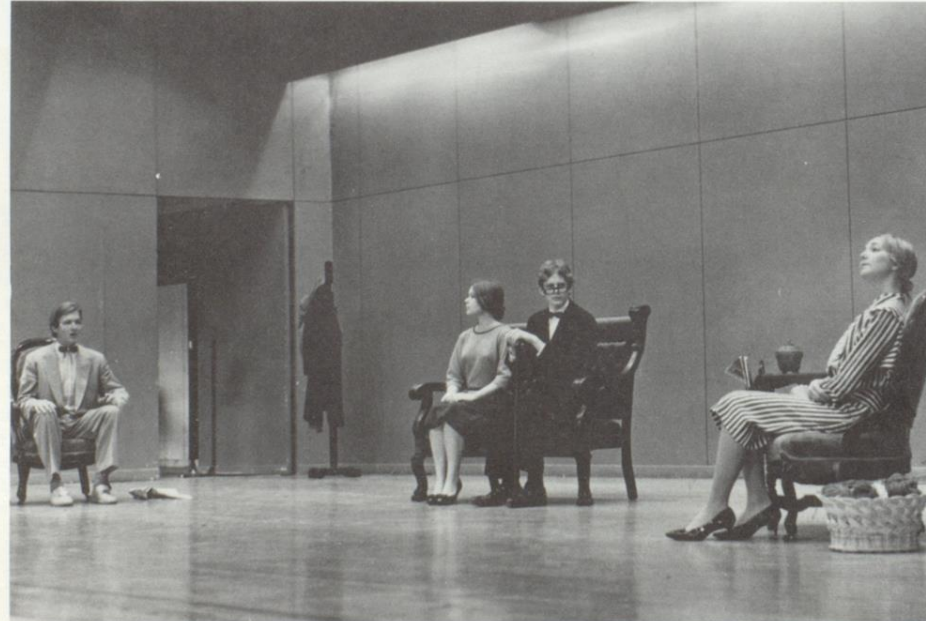

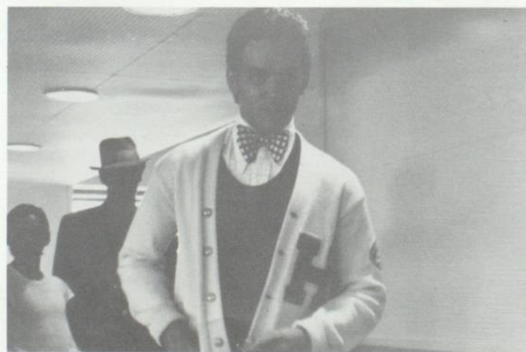

Baccalaureate Held On May 25.

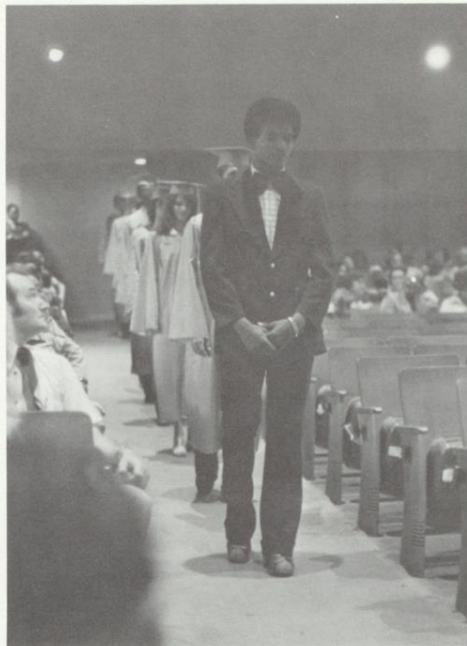

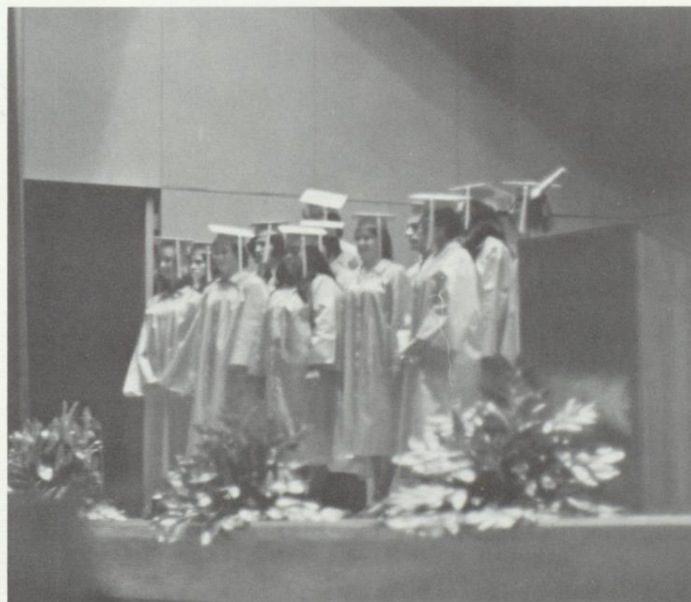

Mr. Neuenschwander, choirs director, took four choirs this year and between these choirs they received two sweepstakes and two superior plaques.

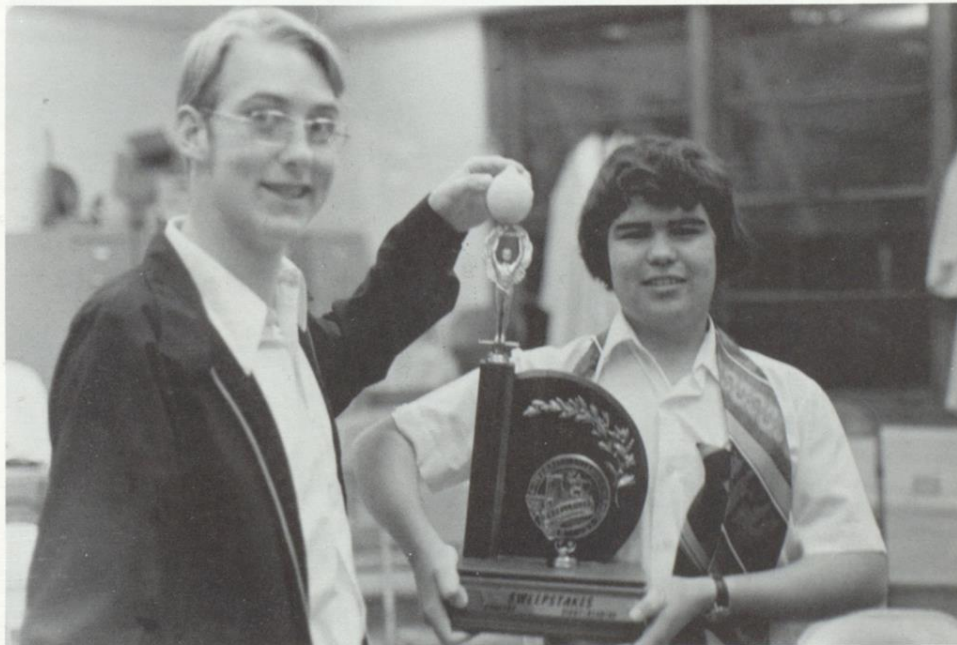
The Trojan Singers were entered as Beeville's second group and received a 1—superior rating in concert and a 2—excellent rating in sightreading.

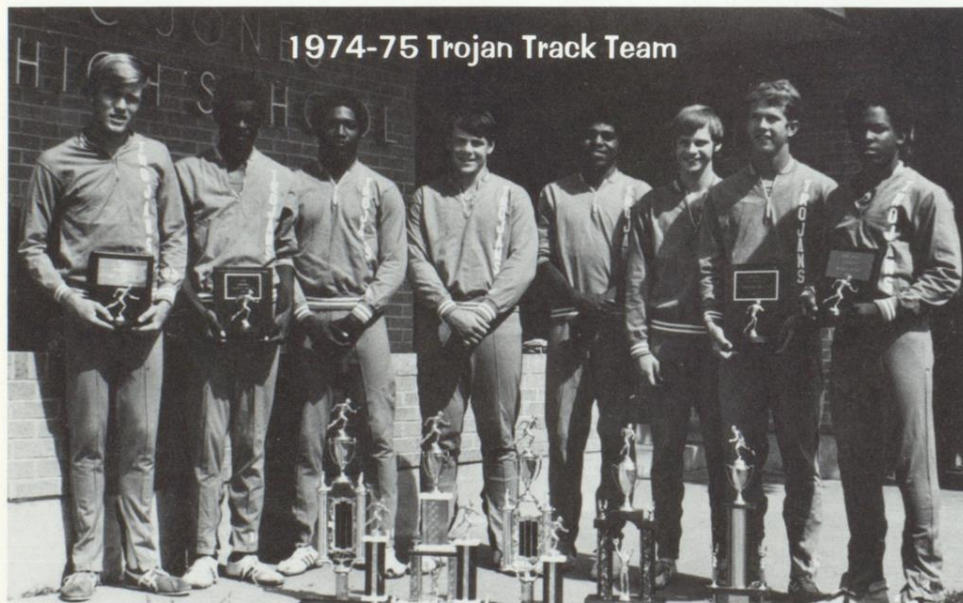
In the pole vault event, senior David Stark took second with a 14-foot vault.

We should all be proud of the good sports program we have in our school.



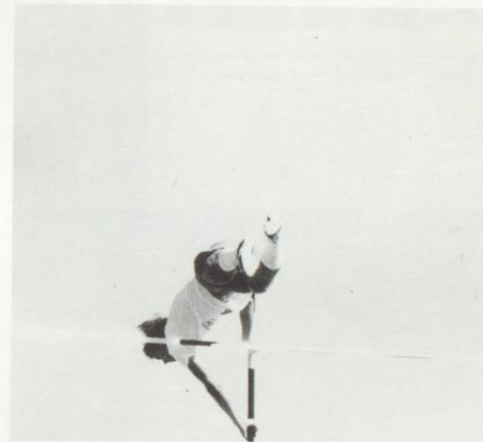
