Scoring began as Richard Crenshaw broke 67 yards on the scrimmage for a touchdown. Randy Luevanos tackled on the extra point.

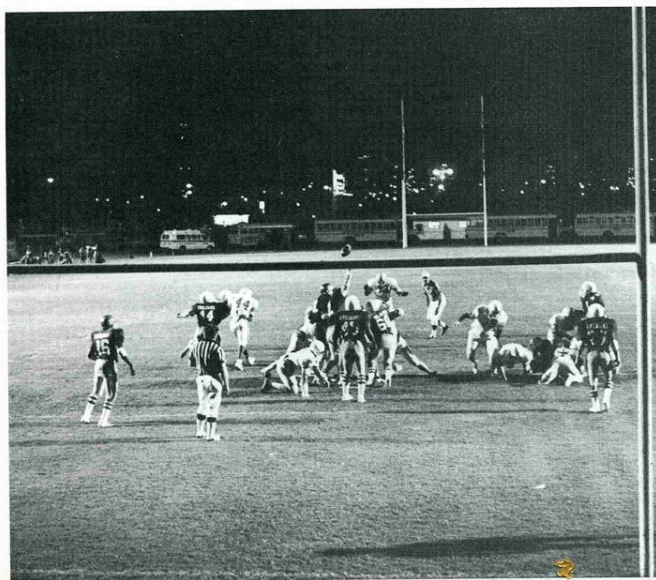

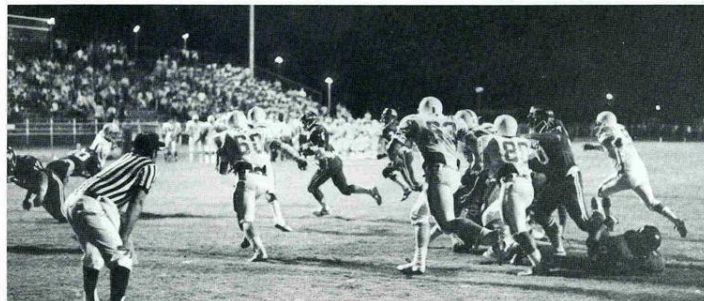
Coach Schmidt's Policy

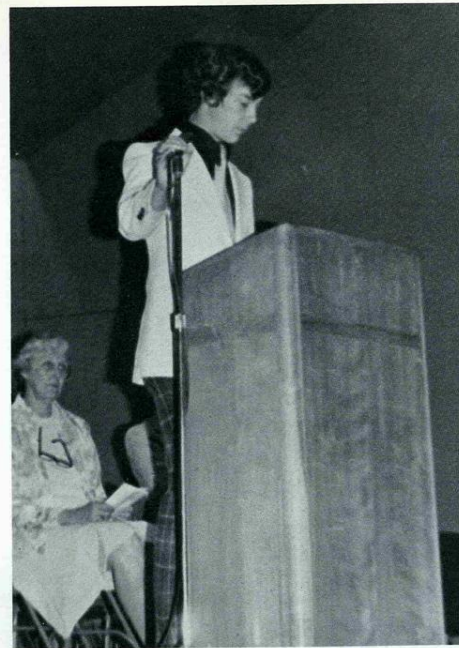

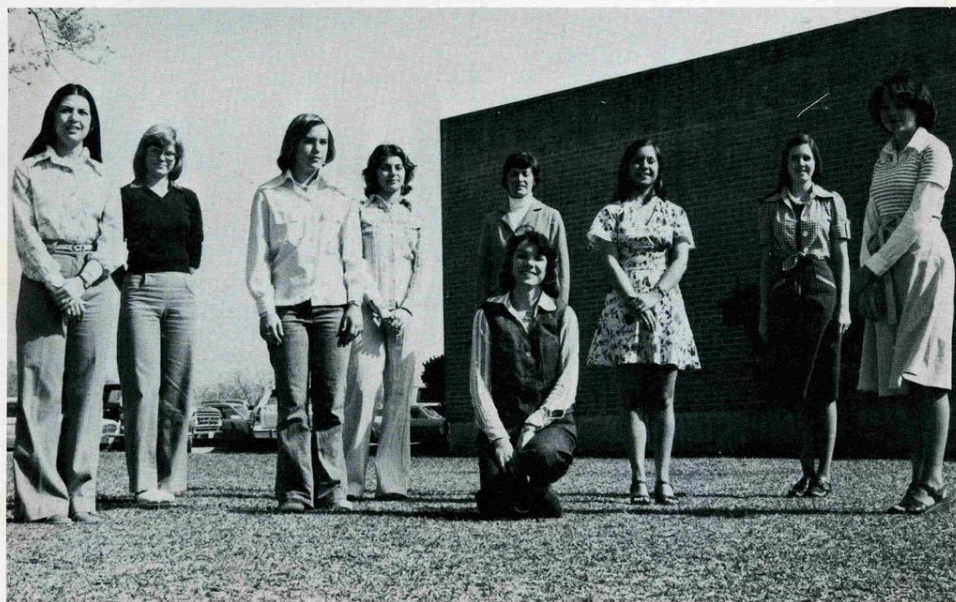

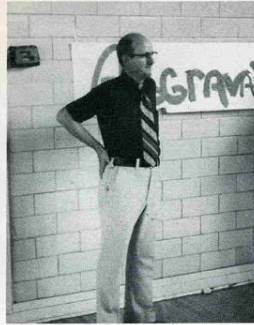

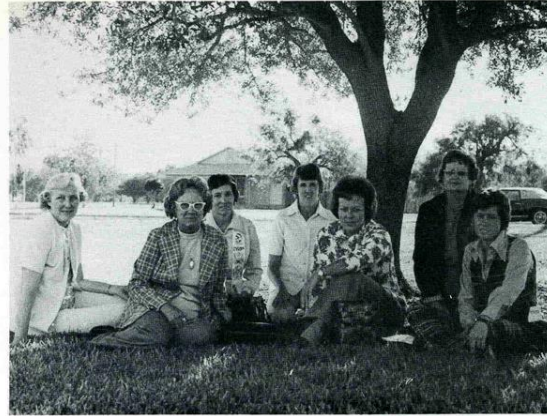
Mathematics Department

Science Department

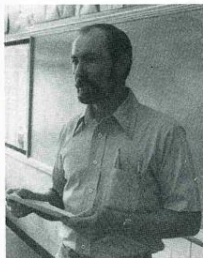
