


The most prominent addition to Beeville's business district was the building of a K Mart.








COYOTES SEND TROJANS HOWLING






TROJANS SCAR WILDCATS

The Wildcats were the first district opponent for the Trojans, and they trounced the Cats to prove that it would be a great season ahead for Coach Schmidt and the Trojan team.








TROJANS SCALP WARRIORS
