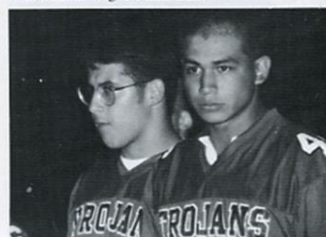

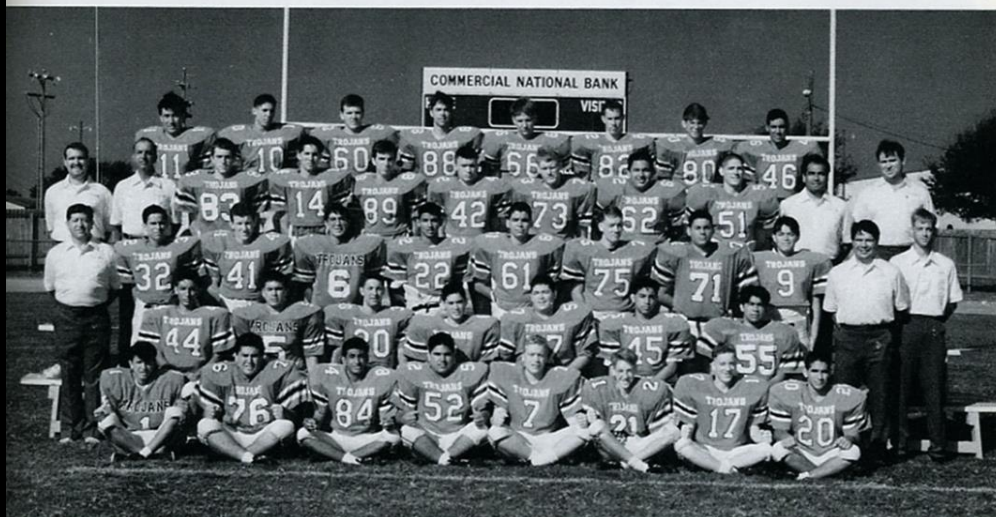

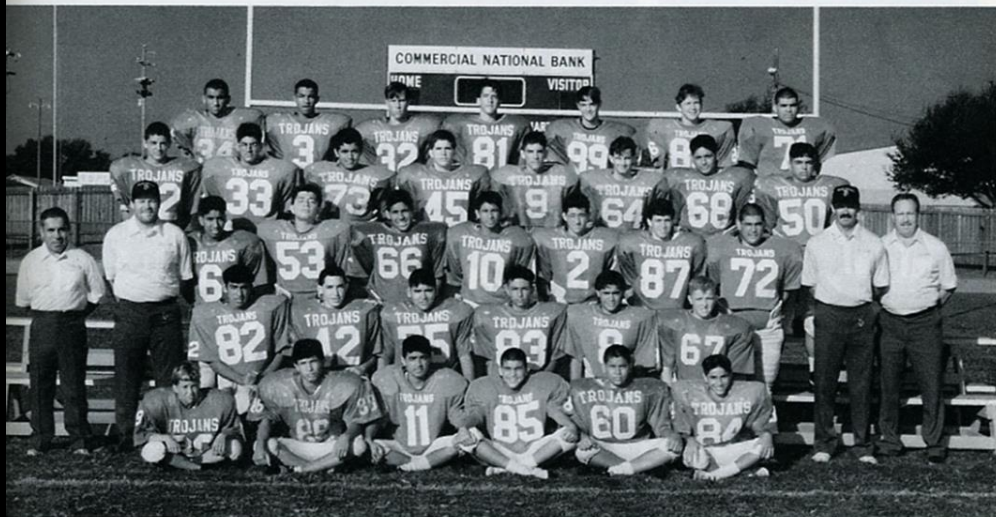

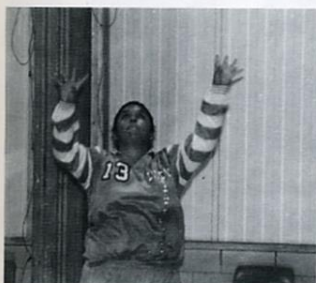

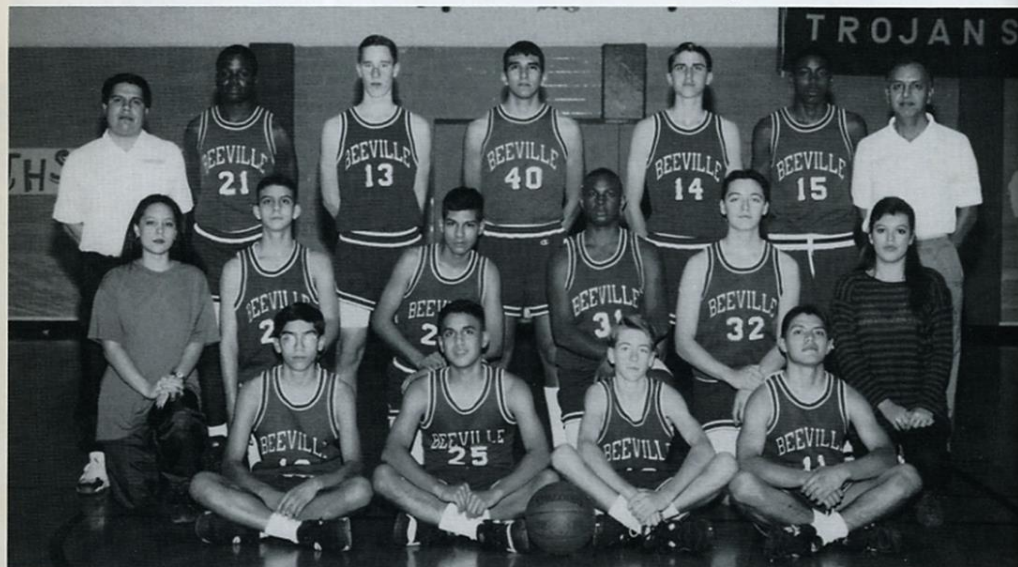

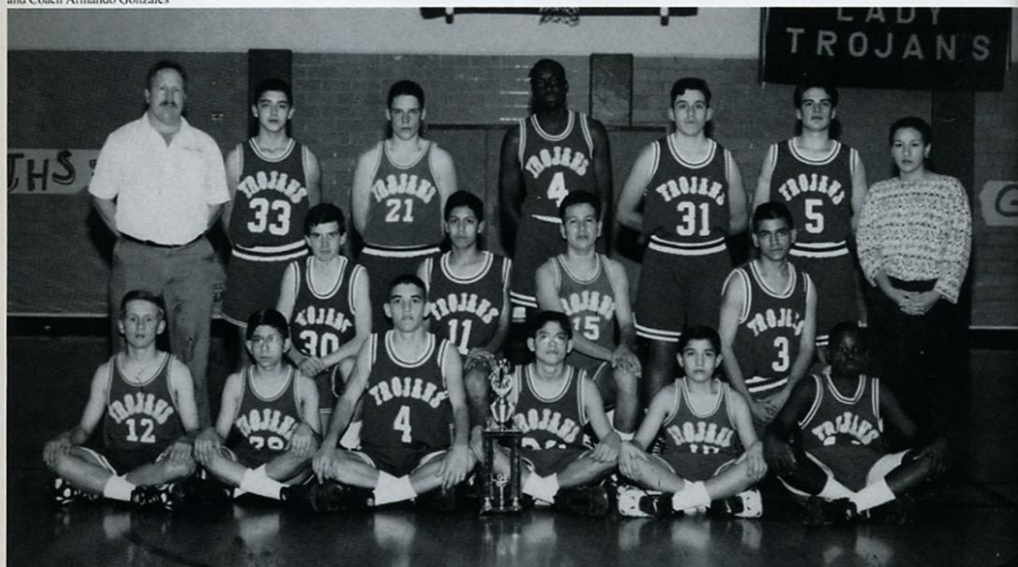

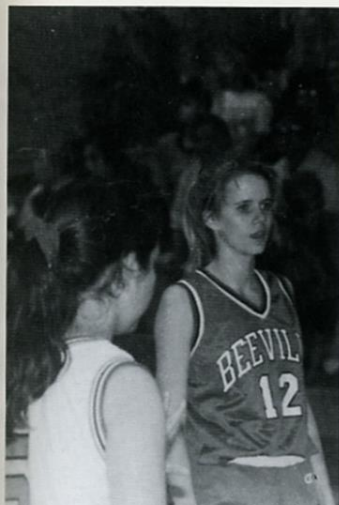

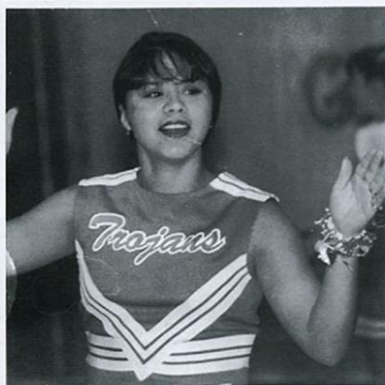

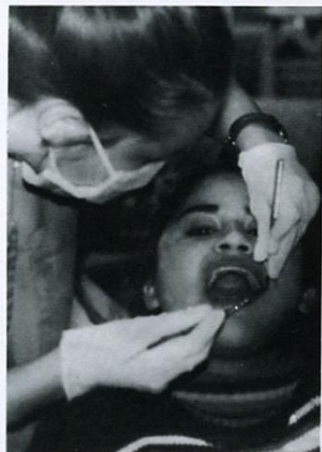

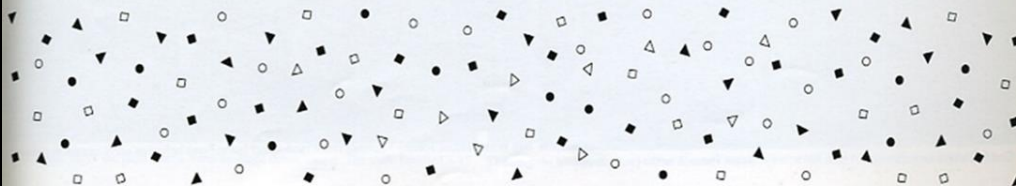

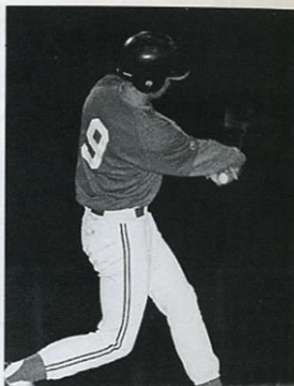

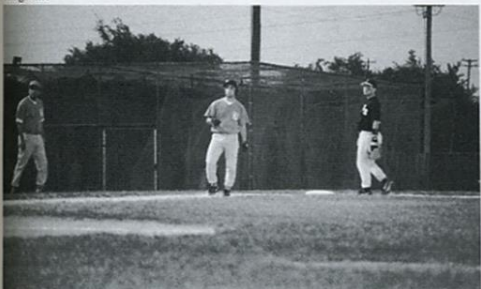

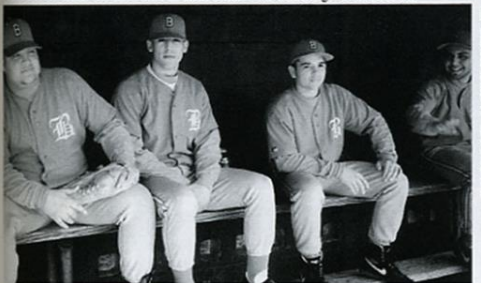

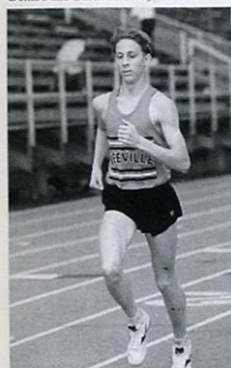

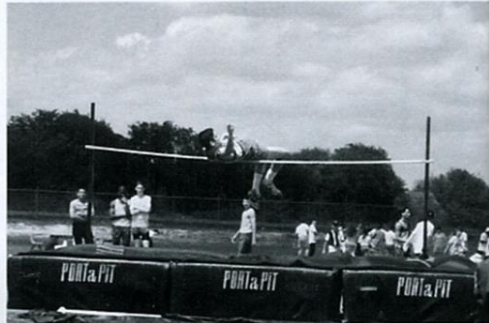

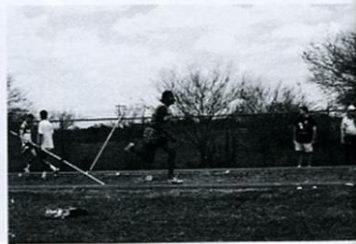

And perhaps, most importantly, there

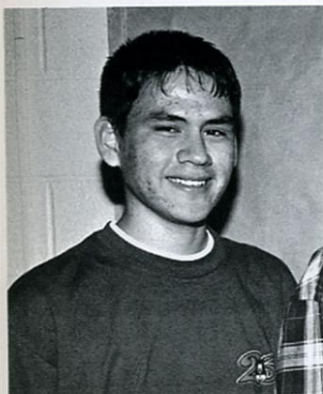
were the friendships developed among academic competitors.

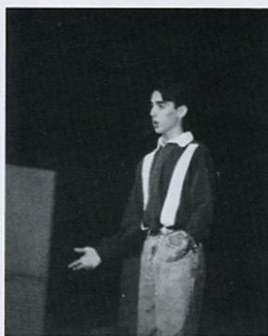

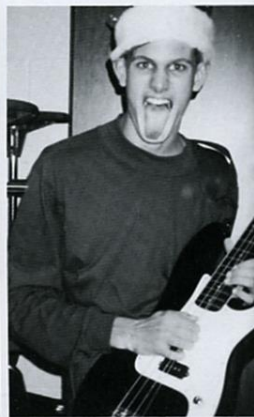

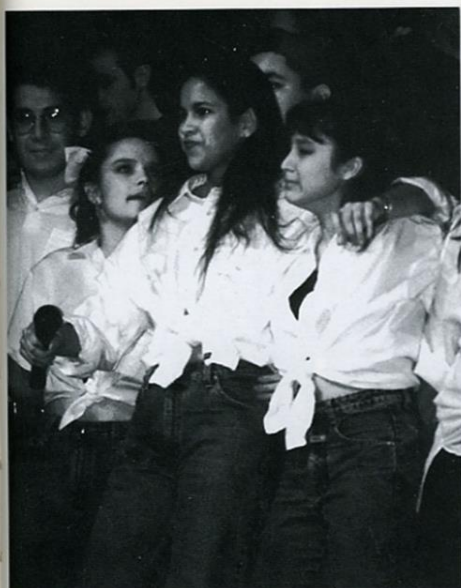

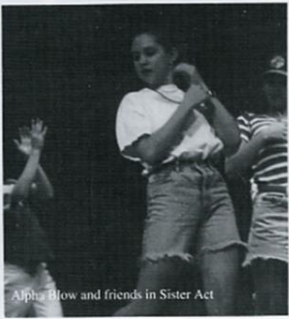

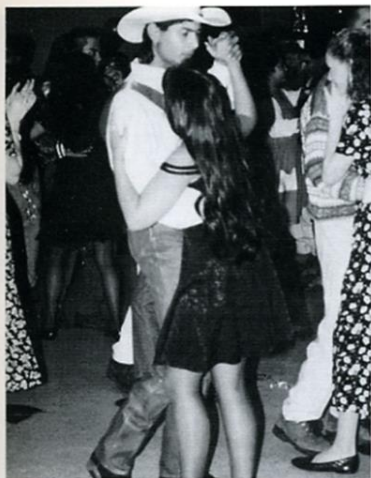

Well, it's really no time to think about this now. Pretty soon it will be time to go across the stage, pick up my diploma and begin another phase of my life.

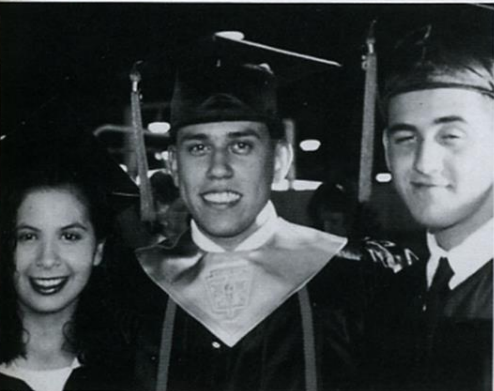

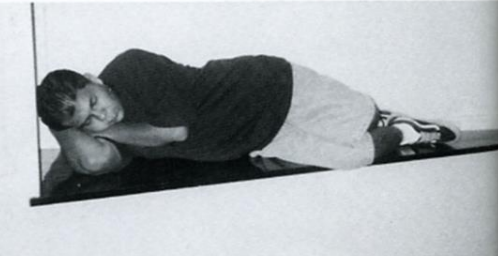

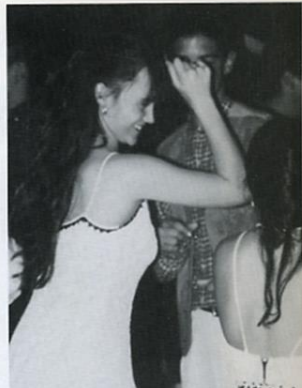

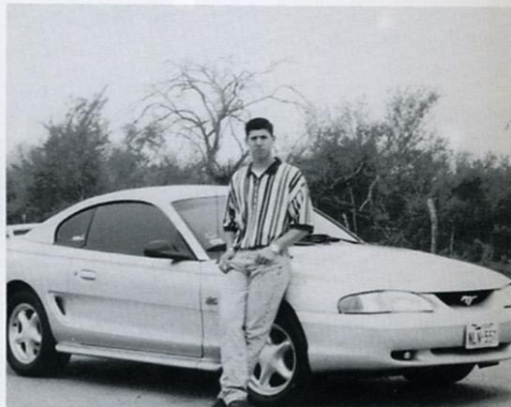

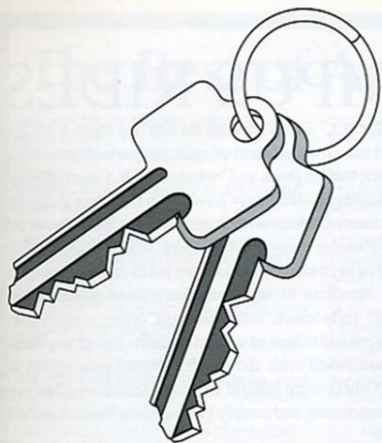

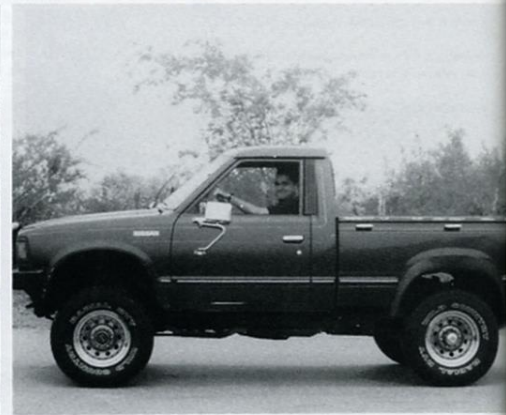

for the Area Championship?

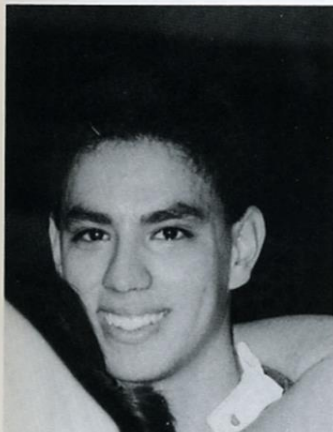
Not even a 96-69 setback to top-ranked Austin Anderson in the Regional semifinals could dampen what had been a fantastic season.

When the 1994-95 school year is looked back upon, the Trojan basketball team will undoubtedly be at the top of the list of memories.

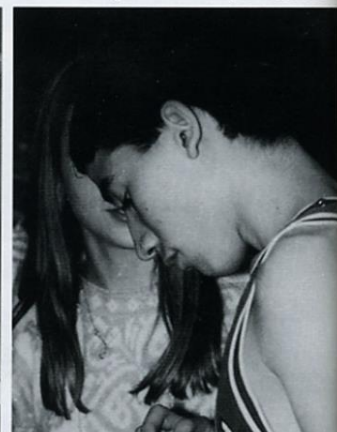

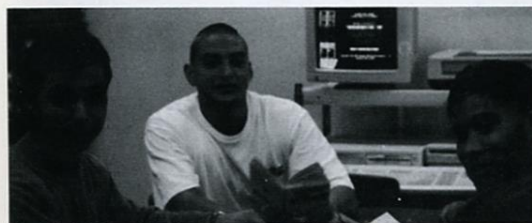

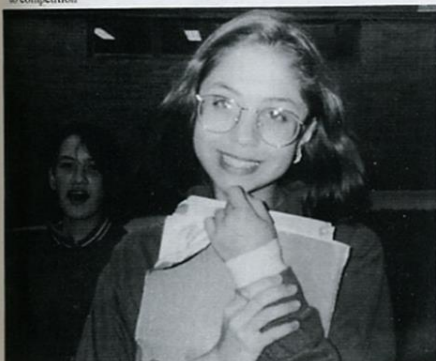

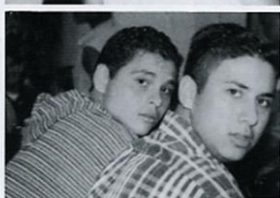
