













A.C. Jones is one of the luckiest high schools around, with two programs that reward, help and assist the stundents. They are the Barnhart Scholarship Foundation and the Renaissance program.

The Joe Barnhart Scholarship Program opened its doors at A.C. Jones on April 15, 1997. Funds for the program come from the foundation named for the late Dr. Barnhart, a former Beeville resident and A.D. Jones graduate. The program helps seniors with that forever burning question: "Where do we go from here?" Headed by Mrs. Paula Duffy and Mrs. Brenda De La Rosa, this has been one of the most succesful programs in helping students graduate from high school, and futher their education. Students meet with individual adult volunteers regularly and work together to apply for college admissions tests, special programs and of course scholarships.

While Barnhart may help students look beyond graduation, Renissance rewards them for all their hard work along the way.

Every six weeks, all the juniors and seniors know that if they make all A's & B's and behave themselves, there's a chance at off-campus lunch. Then at the end of the year, if grades are right students get an ultra cool shirt like this years "Striver" model.

What's the incentive for freshmen and sophomores to excel academically? Year-end shirts are one reward, but semester parties that allow students to miss class and win other prizes are others. High grades and adding another honor to high school resumes are additional bonuses that come with Renaissance recognition.

"Practice does not make perfect," coach Terry Foster told the wrestlers throughout the season. "Practice of perfection makes perfect."


That advice and new "strictly wrestling" facilities helped motivate the team to its title. It also helped spur the junior varsity squad on to win the district [V title.
