The doubles stars, TALLY and PURSLEY, held up the record of E. H. S. in the county tournament against all opposition. In the district they were slightly off form and only rated third.

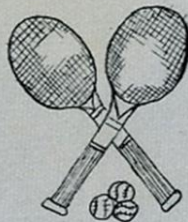

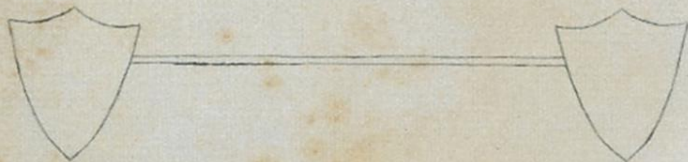

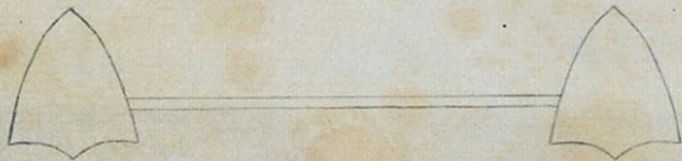
