
Doing this year's Junior class section has helped me get to know my classmates better. We hope when you look back at your class it will help you remember the fun and crazy things that happened during this school year.


Us In Beeville

This year has seen Beeville growing and changing in more ways than ever before. As the population has increased, new businesses have been added to the local economy and expansion of old businesses and buildings have changed the look of the whole city.

The most prominent addition to Beeville's business district was the building of a K Mart.

Along with private expansion has come the need to enlarge the public sector of the community. The Bee County Jail has been inadequate for a number of years and when the final vote was in, it was decided that the jail would be expanded.

The election on April 7 saw new members elected to the City Council. They are now responsible for leading the city down the road to prosperity as it grows and develops.



TROJANS CORRAL MUSTANGS






TROJANS SCAR WILDCATS


TROJANS HORRIFY HORNETS
