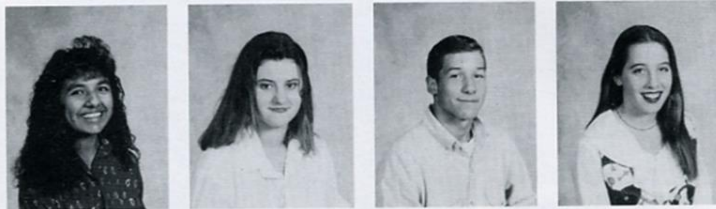

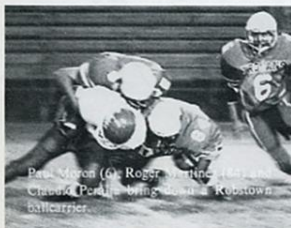

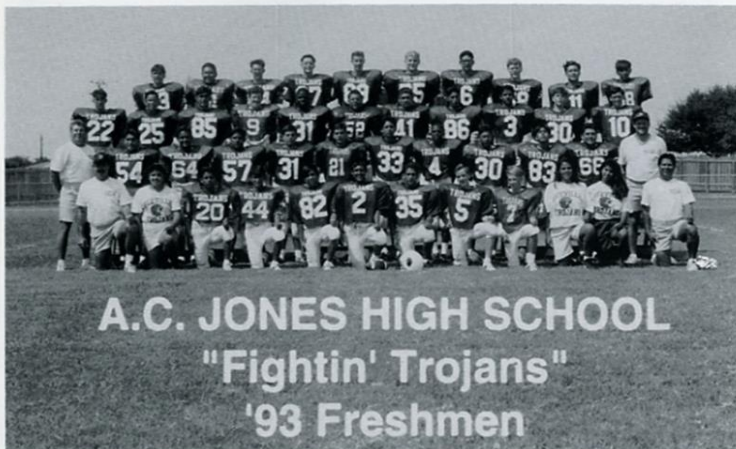

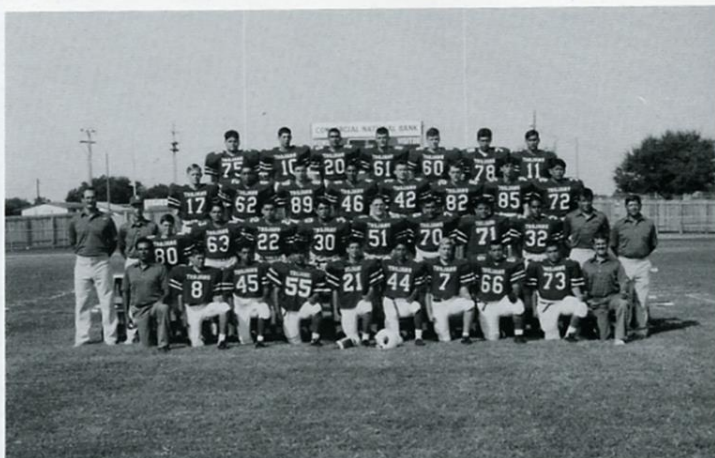

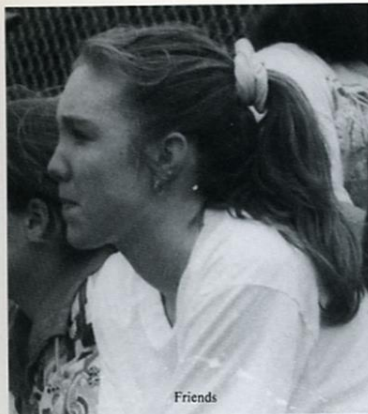

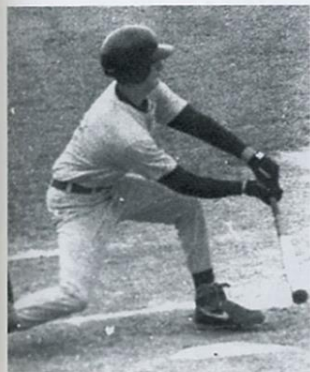

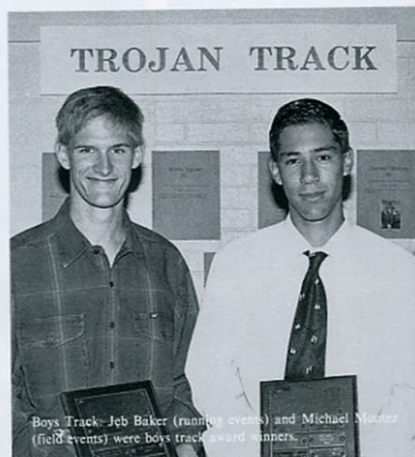

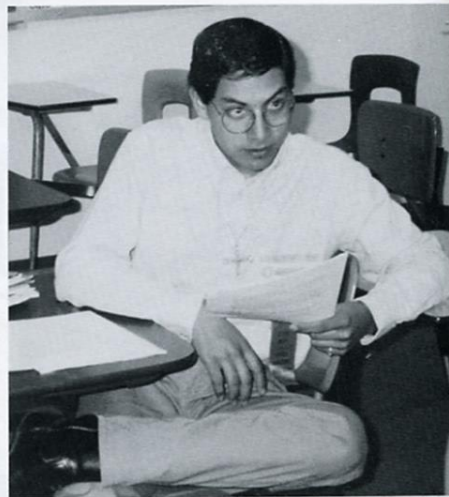

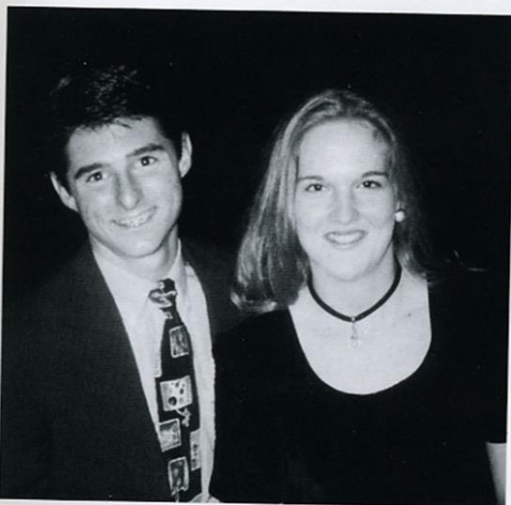

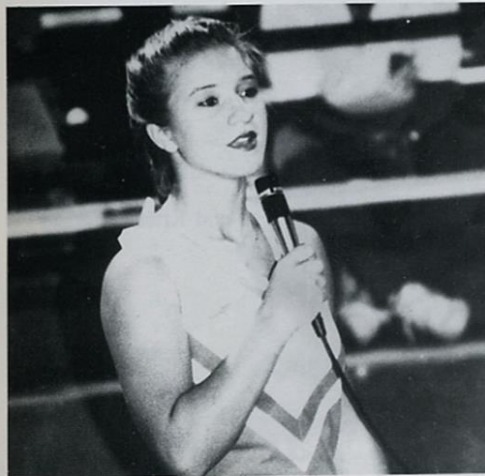

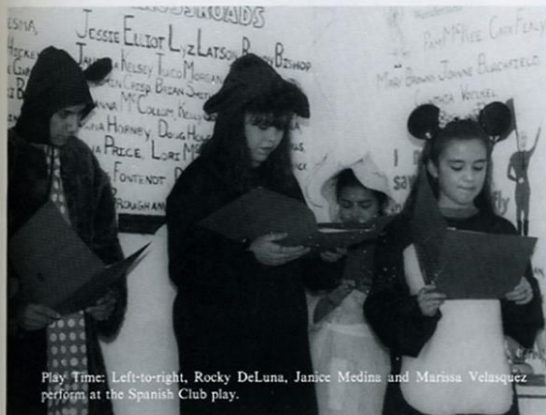

7. Arkansas wins the NCAA men's basketball championship over Duke, 76-72. North Carolina downs Louisiana Tech, 60-59, for the women's title.
