It has been a year of change and building. But the biggest difference that came out of all the new is that in the end, we have been able to celebrate the year together.

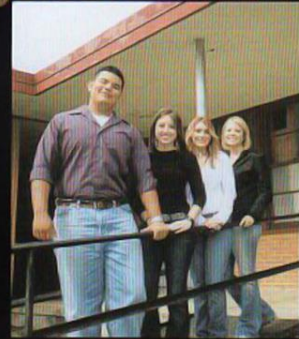

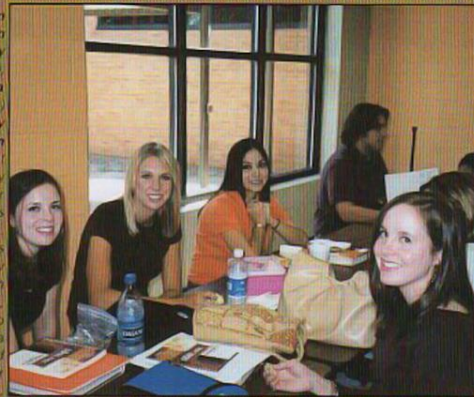

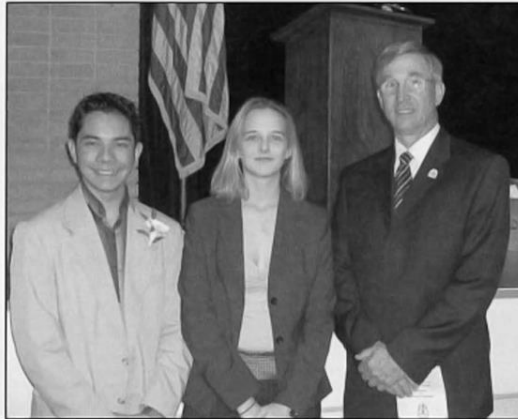




# NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY

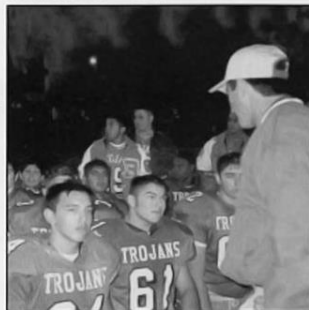


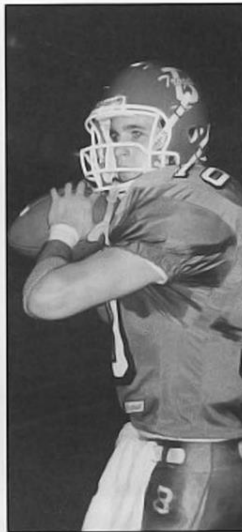
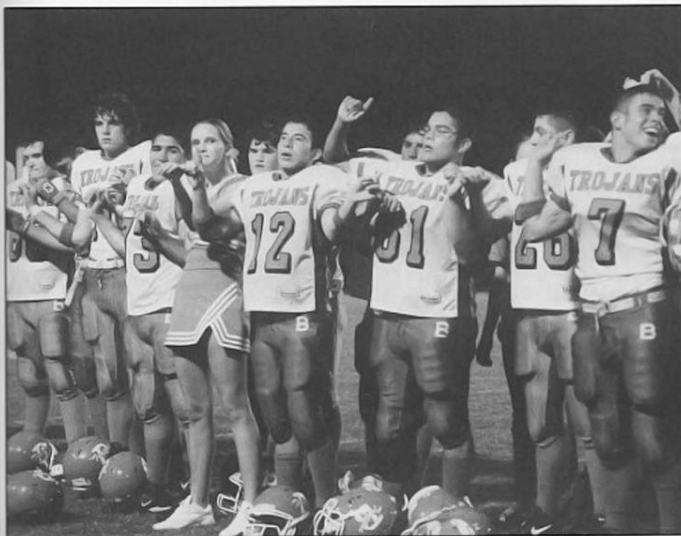
## ENDING ON A HIGH

## REBUILDING A WINNING TRADITION ON THE COURT

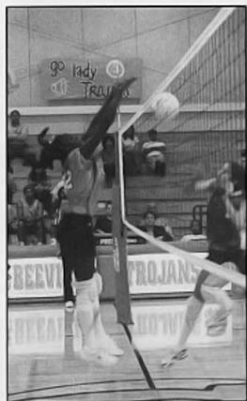

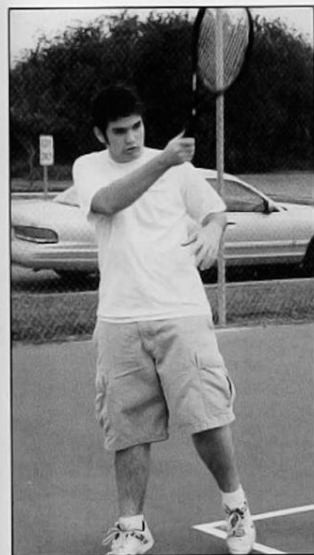

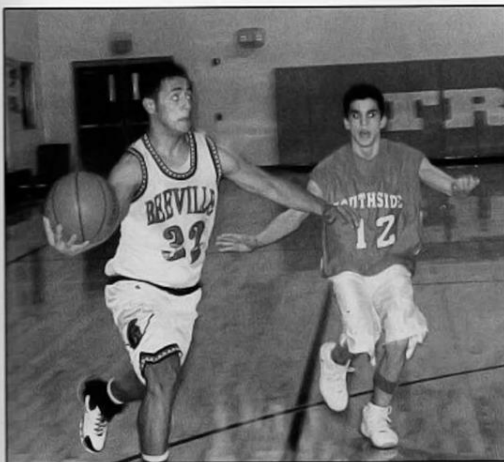
## LONGTIME COACH SEES LAST SEASON

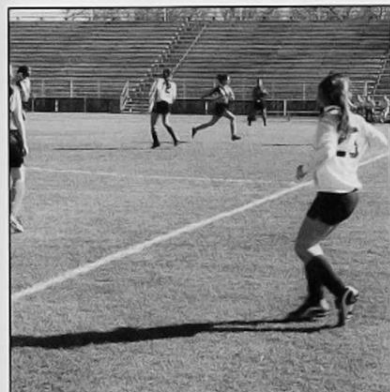

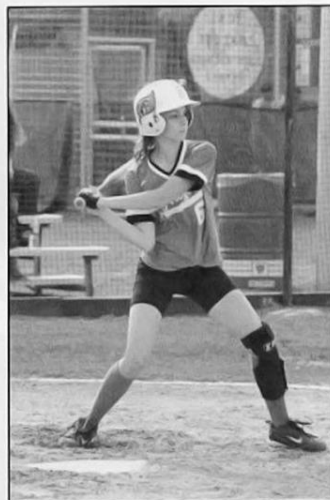

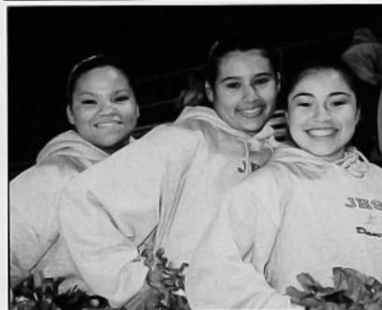

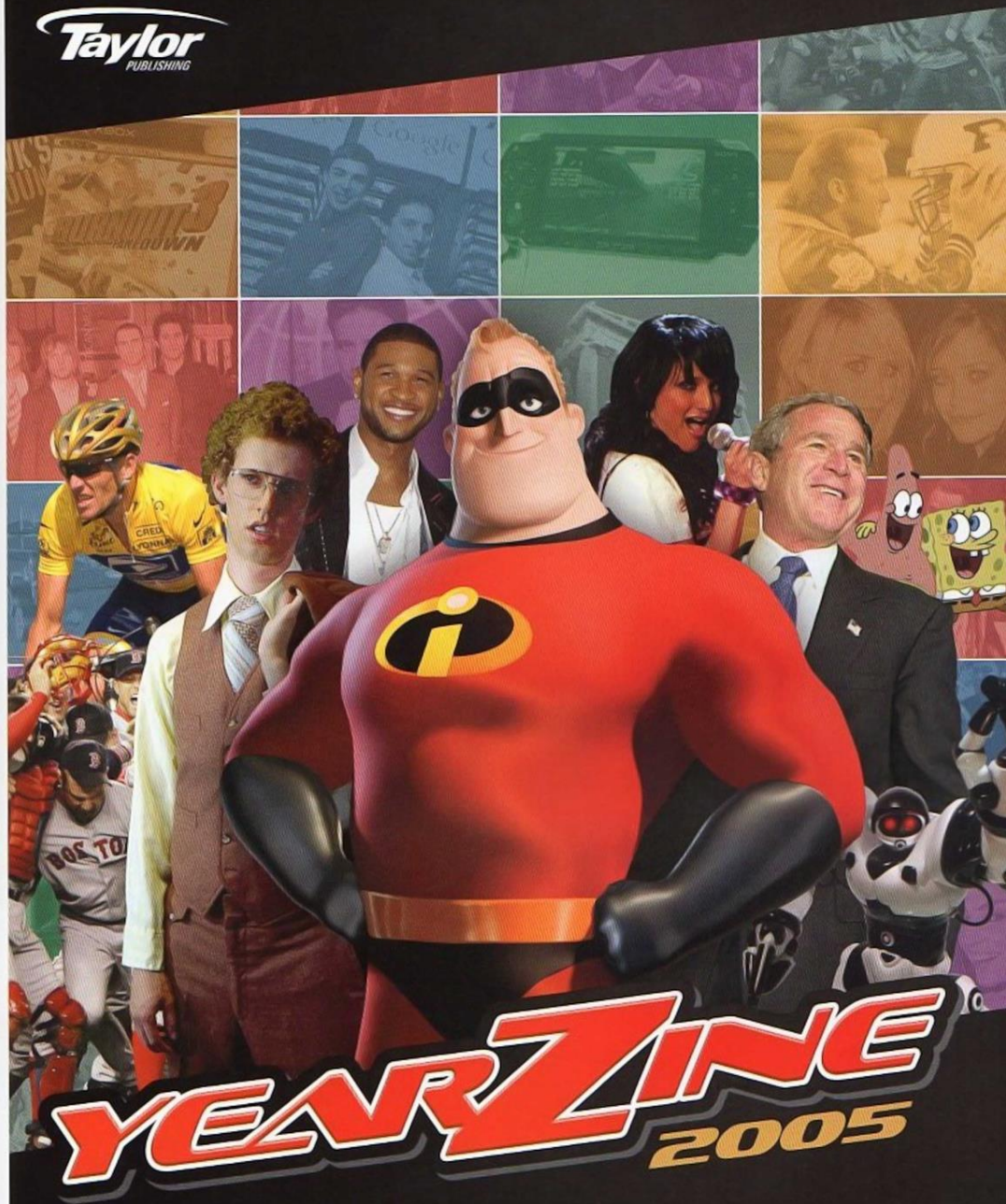


## DEDICATION & COLOPHON

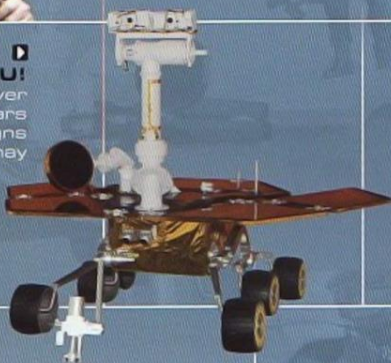

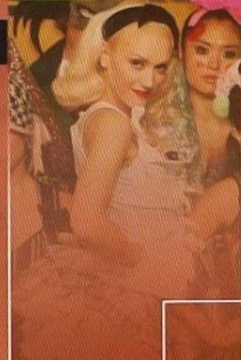
